#### President's Message


#### Greetings,

Get to know your By-Laws

# Article III Membership Section 3

Members are required to pay annual membership dues of \$25 until age 60, then \$20 for those 60–80 years of age. Any Member who reaches the age of 80 will no longer pay dues and will be awarded lifetime membership.

Dues are payable by January 1<sup>st</sup>. Members who have not paid by February 1<sup>st</sup> will be dropped from the roll and will not receive the newsletter until dues are paid. Members who join on or after July 1<sup>st</sup> shall pay one-half of the annual fees.

# Article IV Officers Section 3

**Treasurer:** The Treasurer serves on the Budget Committee and is responsible for preparing a proposed budget prior to meeting with the Budget Committee using year-end financials. Once the Board has approved the opposed budget for the year, the Treasurer is responsible for presenting the proposed budget to the general membership for approval at the January general meeting. After general approval the President's signature is required. The Treasurer is also responsible for preparing monthly financial statements for the Board of Directors including assets, an income statement, and year-to-date income/expenses compared to the current year's budget.



## Article VI Board of Directors Section 2

A Christmas gathering in December will take the place of the regular meeting.

#### Section 3

Files of officers and Committee Chairmen will be forwarded to their successors at a joint January Board meeting.

#### Article VII

### Standing and Special Committees

2. <u>Budget</u>: The Budget committee shall consist of the Treasurer, President & Vice-President and chaired by an individual appointed by the President. The Treasurer will prepare a proposed budget for review by the Budget Committee and then submit the committee's recommended budget to the Board prior to the January meeting. The Board's recommended budget will be published for the members prior to the January meeting and will also be available at the meeting. Publication can be made by e-mail. The Treasurer will present the recommended annual budget to the general membership at the January meeting at which time it will be voted on for approval. The approved budget should then be signed by the President and filed.

#### Article X

## Standing Rules

3. At the regular meeting in December, the retiring President shall be presented with a gavel charm/pendant and other suitable token(s) of appreciation with a combined cost not to exceed \$200. Should a person serve more than one term as President, an alternate suitable token of appreciation shall be presented following each additional term of office.

## How to make Continuous Bias Binding

#### Calculate Yardage needed for Bias Binding:


- Calculate yardage needed for your binding. Two times the side measurement of the quilt, PLUS two times the width and add 10". Example: 40" (width) x 40" (length) Quilt; 40" x 2 = 80, 40" x 2= 80; add together: 80 + 80 = 160 + 10 = 170 total inches needed.
- 2. Find the area of the binding. Don't panic, it's not that hard. Simply multiply 170 by the width of the binding strips you like to use. In our example, we will use 2½" wide strips since this is the most common width of binding suggested. The formula (sorry, quilters math here) is 170 x 2½ = 425 square inches of fabric to make the binding. That seems like a lot, but don't worry, the next step will help you get the total yardage needed for your binding.
- 3. The next step is to get the square root of the area so you can know what size of square to cut. DON'T PANIC—this is easy. Using a calculator with a square root function, type in the 425 (or whatever number you came up with for your quilt) and hit the square root function. If you don't have that, just use Google. The square root of 485 = 20.61. Round UP to the nearest inch, which would be 21" and cut a 21" square. See, it's not that difficult.

#### **Making Continuous Bias Binding:**

Cut the square in half once on the diagonal.





- Using a ¼" seam allowance, stitch the two pieces of fabric right sides together. Press seam open.
- 4. Your fabric should now be a parallelogram. Now draw lines on the wrong side of your fabric in the desired width of your binding strips. Be sure you are following the bias edge of your fabric; this will be the longest edge. We used the Frixion pen to mark our lines, but feel free to use your favorite marking tools.





- Bring the short edges together to form a tube, with right sides together. Match raw edges, and
  offset drawn lines by one (otherwise, you will cut rings of fabric and not a continuous strip). Pin to
  keep your cutting lines in the appropriate position, and sew, right
  sides together using a ¼" seam allowance.
- Proceed to cut your binding strips on the lines you drew previously
- 7. Press seams open then press binding strips in half lengthwise
- 8. Attach your binding to your quilt using your favorite method.

Vice President: Carolyn Bradshaw talked about the Bargello class she is teaching after the meeting. Nov will be a Charity Sew Day. Bring machine if you want to sew, other activities will be available. List on the Facebook Member Page has suggested items for the Sew Day. A sign-up sheet for soup & sandwiches was passed. The meeting & Sew Day are one week early this month, on 11/21/2024.

2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President: Kay Tindall asked members to turn in In-Kind Forms. Either emailed or turn in at the Nov & reminded members' dues collection will begin in Nov. Ways & Means: Nancy Kopecky thanked everyone for helping at the Sampler Store. Items were purged that have been left over from prior years through donation. Quilt poles are also being purged, 8 have been taken so far. If you want one, she has a sheet being passed around. There are 2 different sizes & 30 to 40 sets are still available & are free. After the purge the guild will rent a smaller air-conditioned locker for our belongings. Bank Exhibit: Donna Zbranek talked about displaying quilts from the Quilt Show.

By-Laws/Parliamentarian: Marcia Neely advised members that some by-laws need rewording & revision for clarity & some committees may be combined.

Diana reminded current officers & committee chairs to get their manuals ready to pass on to next year's officers & chairs. Duties should be made clear in the manuals.

Community Service: Carolyn Bradshaw is going to Gabrial Project next week to drop off donation items.

Donation Quilt: Kat Kelley donated a quilt called 'All About Hugh' designed by Nancy Rink. It is already

finished. The first stop to quilt guilds next year to sell tickets will be to Missouri City.

**Education:** Beth Hatla & Beth Staggs were not present so Diana Henderson spoke about using a Mr. Clean Magic Eraser to clean the sole plate of an iron.

**Publicity:** Marisol Johnson asked members if anything was seen in the Victoria Advocate about the Quilt Show. **Houston Bus Trip:** Joy Reed presented details about the trip to the Houston International Quilt Show.

**Library Exhibit:** Pat Johnson informed members that we will display quilts at the library in the months of June & July 2025. She would like to display challenge pieces for a '4th of July' theme. There is room for 6 quilts, at least 72" long. She will also display items in cabinets.

**Silver Thimble Award:** President Diana Henderson talked about nominations & Yvonne Bonorden passed out forms. This award will be presented in the Dec.

Quilt Show: Anna Harrison thanked everyone for their help. 397 attendees came to the show, which is down by about half from previous years. Suggestions were made on ways to improve attendance for future shows, including staying open later Friday, having the show every other year & where to advertise. Kat Kelley suggested having a contest for high school age students to bring in parents & grandparents. The discussion was tabled. The financial report for the Quilt Show was read; some bills & incomes are still outstanding. Lynn thanked Yvonne for filling in for her in her absence.

**Website:** Penny Swan is stepping down from updating the website next year. Marisol Johnson has offered to take on her duties.

**Nominating Committee:** Donna Zbranek came forward to announce candidates for officers next year. They are Diana Henderson for President, Joy Reed for 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, Yvonne Bonorden for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, Kay Tindall for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, Membership, Lynn Miori for Treasurer, Kathy Sheeran for Secretary & Nancy Kopecky for Ways & Means. Voting will be in Nov & officers will be installed in Dec.

Visitors from the **Coastal Prairie Quilt Guild** presented their quilt & gave suggestions for advertising. They suggested selling advance tickets on Event Brite & HIQS. Door Prizes & Show & Tell were presented. The meeting adjourned at 11:10 am.
