

Get to know your By-Laws

Article IV

Officers

Section 4

Nomination and Election of Officers:

1. A Nominating Committee named by the President at the August meeting shall be made up of five members, two from the Board of Directors and three from the membership at large. The membership will vote on approval at the August meeting.

In the October newsletter, the Nominating Committee will publish a slate of officers who have consented to serve if elected. The nominees will be presented to the general membership at the October meeting at which time additional nominees will be accepted from the floor. If additional nominees have given their consent, members will write on a piece of paper their choice for that office. Elections of new officers will then be affirmed by a majority vote.

ARTICLE VII

Standing and Special Committees

1. Audit: One Guild member, not serving on the Board, is named by the President and approved by the membership at the October meeting, shall audit all books of the treasurer and any other funds of the Guild. All books shall close by December 31. If it is deemed necessary, a professional audit may be called for. If no professional audit is called for, the audit report will be presented by the audit person at the January meeting. The audit must then be approved by the Board and membership along with the yearend financials for the Guild.

ARTICLE X

Standing Rules

4. At the October meeting, each member may cast one vote for the person who has contributed outstanding effort and personal commitment toward the betterment of this organization. Previous recipients of the award are not eligible. The vote will be conducted and tallied by recipients of the previous year's awards. At the December meeting, a silver thimble (not to exceed \$60) will be awarded to the member receiving the largest number of votes.

Come join this class and work on a small project (only 20 strips) and learn the technique. Taught by our own guild member, *Carolyn Bradshaw*.

Fabric Requirements:

Twenty 2.5" width of fabric strips (or 1/2 of a jelly roll)

5/8 yards for border 1/2 yard for binding



1) Select 20 jelly roll strips and arrange them in the order you want to the colors to flow. Refer to



the picture for reference.

- 2) Sew the 20 strips together with a 1/4" seam allowance.
- 3) Press the seams in opposite directions. In other words, press the first seam down, the second seam up, the third seam down, and so on.

Bus Trip: Joy Reed reported on the bus trip to the Houston International Quilt Festival. The bus will come out of Corpus Christi, cost more than last year, and will pick up earlier, at 7:15 a.m. The name of the bus company is Distant Brothers. Cost for members is \$60.00 and cost for non-members is \$70.00. This cost includes the tip for the driver. The date of the trip is November 1, 2024.

<u>Bank Exhibit</u>: Donna Zbranek's quilt, Grandma's Flower Garden, is currently on display. Next month's display will be a quilt by Marcia Neely.

<u>Donation Quilt:</u> Donna Zbranek told members about trips made to Corpus Christi, Luling and Rockport, where she collected \$440 by selling tickets. Year to date, \$1,138 has been collected along with more due to some deposits not yet made. Donna Zbranek and Jo Ellen Comstock will travel to Smithville on Sep. 9 to sell the last of the tickets.

Education: Beth Hatla gave a presentation about which way to mount thread on your machine due to direction of how it is wound. She also talked about methods for pressing seams.

Hospitality: Teri Scheibelhut told members that Kay Tindall had knee surgery. Nancy Kopecky is having knee surgery on Monday. Nancy Penry is still recovering. Quilt Show: Anna Harrison reported that we only have 35 entries so far. The volunteer list was passed around again for sign-ups. Pat Johnson needs notions for baskets being put together for the silent auction. Sampler Store set up will begin at 9:00. Kathy Sheeran asked for more quilted jackets for a display. Teri Scheibelhut informed members that she has entry forms or they can get one on the website and email it to her. Lynn Miori asked members to bring non-perishable items to donate to the food bank and member will get \$1.00 off price of show ticket. Nancy Kopecki reported that the gift cards with Smarties taped on were finished yesterday. Marcia Neely told members that the t-shirts have been ordered and will be available for pick up at Quilt Show set up.

Nominating Committee: Diana Henderson announced candidates for the nominating committee. They are Nancy Kopecki, Joy Reed, Jo Ellen Comstock, Eddy Faust, and Donna Zbranek. Kathy Sheeran made a motion to accept the nominating committee members. Jean Gisler seconded the motion. Motion passed. Diana Henderson announced there will be no meeting next month due to the Quilt Show. There is Board Meeting in September. Heritage Bench: Marcia Neely made a motion for the guild to spend \$500 to sponsor a Heritage Bench with a downtown location for City of Roses. Donna Zbranek seconded the motion. Motion passed. Door prizes were awarded and Show and Tell was presented. Meeting adjourned at 10:32 a.m.
